## may's PIIYfUl Iearning Checklist

I. Read The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle together and then set up a picnic filled with healthy foods from the story strawberries, oranges, apples, plums, cheese. Ask your child what she enjoyed most and least.
2. When you make purchases and receive coins as change, give them to your child and talk about them. "What is the same between these coins? What is different? What coin is the biggest? The smallest? This one is called a dime..."
3. Use things from your backyard or local park to make patterns. For example, lay down a rock, a flower, then a rock and a flower. Ask your child to add the items that come next in the pattern.
4. Read your child's favorite story together. Then ask, "What do you think happened AFTER the story ended?"
5. Help your child send a handwritten postcard from your town or state to a long distance friend. Ask the friend to mail a card from her state back to you. When you receive it, find her hometown on a map.
6. Use sidewalk chalk to draw an outline of your child on the driveway.

Help him measure his height and width with a measuring stick.
7. Work together to brainstorm words that start with the same sound as May.
8. Practice your family's fire evacuation plan or, if you don't have one, create one.
9. Place a celery stalk in a glass of water with food coloring. What does your child think will happen? Watch the stalk over several hours. When the dyed water begins traveling up it, explain that plants move water from the soil to their leaves through tiny tubes that act just like straws.
10. Help your child use a calendar to count the number of months until his birthday.
